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The volume, guest edited by Dr. Jeffrey C. Splitstoser, assistant research professor of anthropology at the George Washington University, will be an interdisciplinary exploration of the complex relations between mathematics and textiles. Essays by emerging and senior scholars from multiple disciplines and time periods (from prehistoric to the present and near future), using a variety of methodologies, will explore such topics as mathematics in fabric structures, textile iconography, weaving practices, constructing and wearing clothing, fabrics as information systems, and other topics, including the re-interpretations of iconographic traditions by new generations.

# The Textile Museum Journal Volume 50, 2023

We invite authors to submit manuscripts on any textile topic for the 2023 *The Textile Museum Journal*, which will be the journal's 50th volume. Manuscripts should be based on original documentary, analytical, or interpretive research on textile arts. We encourage submissions examining the cultural, technical, historical, and aesthetic significance of textiles through time and across cultures.

The Textile Museum Journal appears in digital and print versions in color, which allows the incorporation of other media, such as video and sound. We encourage authors to consider incorporating those formats into their articles. Full-length articles for the journal typically range from 5,000 to 10,000 words, including endnotes, figure captions, and bibliography. We also accept submissions for research notes and book reviews, which range in length from 2,000 to 3,000 words.

Article proposals/abstracts (250–300 words), a few samples of the visual material, and a brief author biography (100 words) for volume 50 are due April 31, 2022, with full articles (5000 to 10,000 words) or research notes (2000 to 3000 words) due on August 31, 2022, with final acceptance subject to double-blind peer review.
